Medicaid Redetermination

During the COVID-19 pandemic the federal government paused the Medicaid eligibility redetermination process to ensure continuity of care for those who were covered by Medicaid. Now that the public health emergency has ended the process of checking for Medicaid eligibility (redetermination) has been reestablished. DHHR began reaching out to Medicaid members via U.S. mail to fill out eligibility forms. This process will continue through January 2024 (twelve months total). The DHHR has a FAQ document to explain the process of redetermination for Medicaid members: Frequently Asked Questions (wv.gov). It also has a toolkit for providers and others: West Virginia Medicaid, Public Health Emergency and Unwinding the Continuous Eligibility (wv.gov).

What's the best thing a Medicaid member can do in the meantime? The best thing for enrollees to do is to update their contact information at wvpath.wv.gov, or call 1-877-716-1212, or email dhhrbcfchangectr@wv.gov.

It is estimated that around 18 million people could lose Medicaid eligibility nation-wide, but more than half will be able to get coverage through their employers, while others can purchase through state insurance marketplaces.
