MCOs Exceed Member Satisfaction in Child Services

In order to satisfy the contractual agreement between each Managed Care Organization in West Virginia and the Bureau of Medical Services, the MCOs must conduct a survey to determine levels of member satisfaction. The survey focuses on measures taken from the adult and child member populations. The data collected will indicate to each plan what they are doing well while uncovering areas of improvement.

These surveys were administered in 2019 but are based on medical information and operations carried out in 2018. Qlarant, a solutions based company, provided a detailed report showing a combined average on how well the plans performed in certain areas against the national average. The aggregate results within the child population shows the three MCOs excelled in all areas of care when compared to the national average. Two of the highest measures were found in Getting Needed Care and Getting Care Quickly. These resulted in a score of 91.68% and 95.86% respectively, nearly 7% above the national average.

The MCOs of West Virginia are always looking to exceed plan performance and improve outcomes. We are proud of our efforts in providing excellent care and service to our Medicaid members, especially children.
