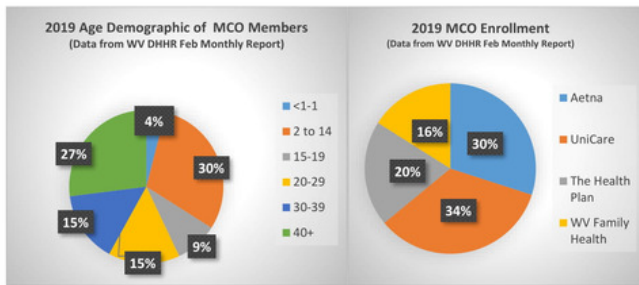

Medicaid by the Numbers

As of February 1, 2019, there are 395,402 members enrolled in West Virginia's MCOs. There are four MCO's that manage our Medicaid program, Aetna Better Health of WV, UniCare, The Health Plan and WV Family Health. The graphs below show the percentages of MCO enrollment, as well as the age demographics of those members in 2019. Children who are 19 years old and younger makeup 43% of our MCOs membership.

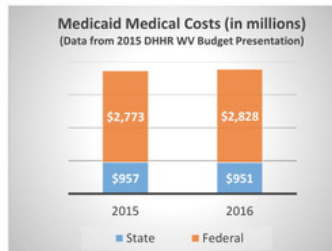


The top 10 counties in WV with over 11,000+ members enrolled into Medicaid are listed below. Also listed are the top ten counties with the highest Medicaid Enrollment Per Capita which make up 31% of the Medicaid population in WV.

Medicaid is a joint federal and state program that helps with medical care for people with limited income. West Virginia opted to expand Medicaid under the Affordable Care Act starting January 1, 2014. As of February 2019, over 148,000 West Virginians are enrolled under the Medicaid Expansion.
